Year 1 Knowledge Organiser: Autumn 2

Reading

The class author focus for Year 1, is Ruth Brown. We are currently reading several of her texts in our class read aloud, such as The Lighthouse Cat and Ten seeds. Our daily Phonics reading sessions focus on reading the sounds we already know, reading fluently and developing our comprehension. At the end of the day during our class read alouds this is where we focus on voice choice

Writing

Writing to inform – We will be creating a storyboard to inform our chosen audience on our chosen text of 'Rapunzel' or 'Little Red'.

Writing to entertain - We will be creating our own retell of our text Beegu making it as entertaining as possible for our intended audience by using illustrations.

Maths

This half term we will be consolidating our knowledge of our number bonds to 10. We will also focus on place value within 10 and simple addition and subtraction of numbers within 10. Later on in the term we will begin sorting and recognising 2D and 3D shapes.

Science

In this topic we will be looking at seasonal changes. We will be exploring and observing the changes across the four seasons and also observing and describing weather associated with seasons and how day length varies.

History

Our history topic this half term is My Family History. This topic is an introduction to the past with my family tree, and how schools, toys and the way we communicate have changed in living memory.

DT

Children will have the opportunity to make their own rainbow fruit salad. The children will have the opportunity to develop fine motor skills when peeting and chopping fruit and vegetables.

Music This half term we will continue using charanga, our unit is 'Rhythm in the way we walk and banana rap'. Children will be practicing and performing the song 'Banana rap' by Joanna Magona and Jane Seeba.

Religion and World Views This half term we will be

focusing on why Christmas is important to Christians. Looking at Christian beliefs on the Nativity and incarnation.
