Knowledge Organiser: My Heroes!



Communication, Language and Literacy:

We will be reading Non-Fiction books where children can ask questions to find out more and to check they understand what has been said to them. They will also develop their listening skills and develop a familiarity with new knowledge and vocabulary.

In writing sessions children will continue to write the initial sound of words and practice correct letter formation. They will also orally plan sentences for adults to scribe. As a challenge some children may be able to write a simple cvc word. i.e cat, dog, mum, dad.

Physical Development:

Develop their small motor skills by threading beads and developing pencil control.

Move energetically, such as running, jumping, dancing, hopping, skipping, and climbing.



Expressive Arts and Design:

Children will make use of props and materials when role playing characters in narratives and stories.

They will invent, adapt and recount narratives and stories with peers and their teacher.

Mathematics:

The Colour

Children will learn to recognise numbers to 4, compare, count and subitise how many are in a group. They will also make their own groups of 1, 2, 3 and 4 using different resources.

They will recognise, name and describe the properties of circles and triangles.

Children will hear and use positional language and begin to represent real places on maps, models and drawings.



<u>Personal, Social and Emotional</u> <u>Development:</u>

Children will learn to express their feelings appropriately and begin to understand the feelings of others. Children will begin to learn how to handle their emotions.



Understanding of the World:

Children will show an understanding of everyday heroes such as nurses, doctors, dentists, police, fire officers and many more.

We will also explore and discuss fictional heroes such as Supertato and Super worm!



How to Help at Home!

Communication, Language and Literacy:

Read lots of Non-Fiction books to allow children to ask and answer questions.

Continue to practice writing their name, with correct letter formation.

Practice writing the first letter in each word. Example: doctor, the child would write the letter d.

doctor, vet, nurse, dentist, postman, lollipop lady, police officer


Understanding of the World:

Talk about everyday heroes such as nurses, doctors, dentists, police, fire officers and why they are important.

Physical Development:

Threading beads and pasta.

Practice holding a pencil with two fingers and your thumb.





Expressive Arts and Design:

Role play different emergency service characters and superheroes from fiction.

Make a junk modelling emergency service vehicle.

Mathematics:

Practice recognising numbers to 4.

Count out 1, 2, 3 and 4 objects.

Find 2D and 3D shapes: Circles and triangles in everyday objects.

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Explore positional language.

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<u>Personal, Social and Emotional</u> <u>Development:</u>

Talk about their feelings and begin to understand feelings of others.

(happy, sad, angry, worried)
